Dear faculties and students,

This is to say that our college has Banned Plastic Bag, Plastic Bottle, Polythene Bag, Plastic Spoon & Aluminium Foil, and required everyone to be replaced with stainless steel bottle, stainless steel Tiffin box, Steel Spoon and to use cloth or Jute bag with effect from August-2019.

Let us join on hands towards keeping our environment eco-friendly.

Guidelines for Ban of Plastic Use in Higher Education Institutions

The University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) have both issued circulars urging educational institutions to plan schemes to introduce alternatives for single-use plastics and organise special programmes for creating awareness as part of the 'Swachhta hi Seva' programme.

This comes in the wake of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's call against the use of single-use plastic, and the Centre's plans to ban the use of plastic items such as carry bags, cutlery, milk pouches, decoration items, packaging materials and bottles, among others.

Authorities have been told to replace plastic cups and glasses at canteens and hostels with steel ones, discourage the use of plastic drinking water bottles, cups, straws, plates and spoons at all hostels and special events. Students have been asked to refrain from bringing plastic Tiffin boxes.

Colleges have to keep a strict vigil on students and conduct surprise checks at student hostels, canteens and other public places on the campus. Principals should encourage students to invent and introduce alternatives to plastics like cloth bags. It stated

Students should be made aware of and discouraged from using takeaway plastics, lunch wrapped in disposable plastic packaging, straws bottles, disposable food service cups and plates and plastic bags.

Guidelines

The following measures were taken in restricting the use of plastic

1. Use paper bags/cloth bags for any shopping purpose.
2. Avoid packed soft drinks
3. Minimize the use of plastic water bottles and use reusable water bottles and cups.
4. Motivating the staffs and students to bring their snacks and lunch in steel Tiffin boxes.
5. Shop vendors are advised not to use any plastic items/covers
